



Changed access to Waterways Drive

From Monday 23 July 2012 access into Waterways Drive from the Gold Coast Highway northbound will permanently change.

Traffic changes:

The western slip lane on the Gold Coast Highway currently used for access to Waterways Drive will be closed (see map).

A new right-turn lane and right-turn signal will be installed for northbound traffic on the Gold Coast Highway to access Waterways Drive (see map).

What to expect:

- Night works will be required for line marking, traffic signal upgrades and works on the Gold Coast Highway. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance of these works.
- During the installation of new traffic signals, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur. Traffic management will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms rather than beepers to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
