



## Night works in Queen Street

From Monday 27 August 2012 GoldLinq will commence delivery of Queensland's first light rail track lengths to Queen Street. The rail, which comes in 18 metre lengths each weighing one tonne, will be laid between Wardoo and Nerang Streets.

Due to their size, the rail lengths must be delivered at night for safety reasons and to minimise traffic impacts. Delivery is expected to take two weeks to complete, weather permitting.



### Traffic changes:

- The eastbound lane of Queen Street will be closed between Wardoo and Mick Veivers Way from 7:00pm to 5:00am.
- During these works no U-Turn will be permitted at the end of Queen Street at Wardoo Street.
- Detour routes via Johnson, Nerang and Pohlman Streets will be signed.
- Reduced speed limit to 40 km/h.
- Limited pedestrian access around the construction area. Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- Residential access will be maintained.
- Traffic management measures such as traffic control and Variable Message Signs will be in place.

### What to expect:

- Majority of works to occur within the dedicated light rail corridor in the middle of Queen Street.
- Rail delivery between 7:00pm and 5:00am Sunday to Thursday.
- Heavy and minor machinery noise including "quacker" style reversing alarms. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.
