Underground service night works

From Tuesday 29 January 2013, night works to upgrade and relocate underground services will begin at the intersection of the Gold Coast Highway and Ferny Avenue for up to four weeks. This work must be undertaken at night to minimise the impact on traffic.

Traffic changes:

- Temporary single lane closures and traffic redirections will occur on the Gold Coast Highway and Ferny Avenue between 7:00pm and 5:00am.
- Local access to Ferny Avenue for residents and businesses will be maintained.
- Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area. Temporary footpath closures near the active work area may occur and alternative routes will be signed.



What to expect:

- Installation of underground services across the Gold Coast Highway, within the centre median of the Gold Coast Highway at Macintosh Island North and at the intersection of Gold Coast Highway and Ferny Avenue.
- Temporary work areas will be contained by safety fencing.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Temporary service outages may occur and will be managed by the appropriate service provider.
- Affected premises will be notified prior to outages occurring in line with current legislated requirements.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30pm and 6:30am, Sunday to Thursday.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
