



## Hooker Boulevard intersection works – Phase 1

From Sunday night 14 April 2013, GoldLinQ will begin underground service relocations, drainage and track preparation works at the intersection of Hooker Boulevard and the Gold Coast Highway. The works will take eight weeks to complete, weather permitting.

### Traffic changes:

#### Phase 1 (three weeks duration)

- One southbound right-turn lane from the Gold Coast Highway onto Hooker Boulevard will be maintained.
- For traffic travelling east on Hooker Boulevard a left-turn slip lane, through-right and right-turn lane will be maintained at the intersection of Hooker Boulevard and the Gold Coast Highway.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area (see map). Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- Existing bus services will not be impacted during construction.
- Periodic slow lane closures of the Gold Coast Highway and Hooker Boulevard will occur from 6:30pm to 6:00am.

### What to expect:

- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction will involve relocating services, above and below ground, such as gas, water and electricity, and upgrading storm water drainage.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

### Night works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance of night works.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.

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## Hooker Boulevard intersection works - Phase 2

From Wednesday 1 May 2013, construction at the intersection of Hooker Boulevard and the Gold Coast Highway will continue. To facilitate Phase 2 of track preparation works, underground services upgrades and drainage installation, Hooker Boulevard will be realigned south and have reduced traffic lanes.

### Traffic changes:

#### Phase 2 (five weeks duration)

- One southbound right-turn lane from the Gold Coast Highway onto Hooker Boulevard will be maintained.
- For traffic travelling east on Hooker Boulevard a left-turn, through-right and right-turn lane will be maintained at the intersection of Hooker Boulevard and the Gold Coast Highway.

### What to expect:

- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction will involve relocating services, above and below ground, such as gas, water and electricity, and upgrading storm water drainage.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area (see map). Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- Construction of new footpaths, kerbs and roadway.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.
- Existing bus services will not be impacted.
- Existing taxi zones will not be impacted.
- Periodic slow lane closures of the Gold Coast Highway will and Hooker Boulevard will occur from 6:30pm to 6:00am.

### Night works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance of night works.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
