

Admiralty Drive Track Laying 72 Hour Partial Closure

From 6:30pm Wednesday 26 June to 6:30pm Saturday 29 June 2013, works to lay rail across the southern section of the Admiralty Drive intersection will occur.

Motorists travelling southbound on the Gold Coast Highway will need to move into the left lane to access Paradise Waters via the pit lane area at Macintosh Island (see map).

The rail, which comes in 18 metre lengths each weighing one tonne, will be laid along the western side of the Gold Coast Highway.

Traffic changes:

Right turn access into Admiralty Drive for southbound traffic on the Gold Coast Highway will be via Macintosh Island.

The slip lane providing a left turn from Admiralty Drive onto the Gold Coast Highway northbound will be temporarily reopened.

During construction, north and southbound traffic access into and out of Paradise Waters will be maintained, however points of access may change.

Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.

What to expect:

- Construction crews will work around the clock to carry out works across the intersection. Motorists are advised to avoid these road works and seek alternative routes where possible.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residence.
- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Construction will include excavation, track form works and installation of underground services.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Traffic controllers and detour signs will be in place.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area. Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed. Pedestrians need to be aware that following traffic control directions is vital for their safety.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.
