


Shared pedestrian and cycle bridge across the Nerang River.

From July 2013 work will begin in Southport Broadwater Parklands to build the shared cycle and pedestrian bridge as part of the light rail construction project. This 5.6 metre wide bridge will link the Parklands with Proud Park at Main Beach.

Pedestrian access under and across the Nerang River Bridge will generally be maintained.

A construction site will be established in the Broadwater Parklands to the east of the existing bridge to store materials and allow work on the northern pilings. Most of the bridge construction will be done from barges to minimise impact.



Trees, signs and park amenities will be restored when the work is completed mid next year.

Traffic changes:

- Some parking spaces in the southbound lanes before the bridge will be removed to provide site entry.
- Traffic control will assist with vehicles entering and leaving the site.
- Reduced speed limits of 40km per hour will apply on Gold Coast Highway.

What to expect:

- Heavy machinery and crane movements.
- There will be temporary and short term footpath closures near the work area, including under the bridge and boardwalk. Alternative routes will be signed.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Night works will be carried out between 6:30pm and 6:30am, Monday to Friday
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.
