
## Clifford Street Intersection Light Rail Track Laying

From Saturday 28 September 2013 the intersection of Clifford Street and Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to west bound traffic to complete track laying works.

The rail, which comes in 18 metre lengths each weighing one tonne, will be laid across the south-western side of the intersection. Due to their size, the rail lengths must be delivered by an oversized vehicle.



## Traffic changes:

- The intersection of Clifford Street and Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all westbound traffic (see map).
- All westbound traffic on Clifford Street will be detoured to Surfers Paradise Boulevard.
- A right turn movement will be installed at Remembrance Drive for traffic diverted to Surfers Paradise Boulevard to return to the Gold Coast Highway (see insert map).
- Temporary traffic signals at the intersection of The Esplanade and Clifford Street will remain in place.
- Alternative routes and redirections will be signed. Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.

## What to expect:

- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area (see map). Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

## Night works:

- Night works will be required to install traffic management from 6:30pm Friday 27 September 2013.
- Additional night works may be required as part of these works. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance of night works.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
