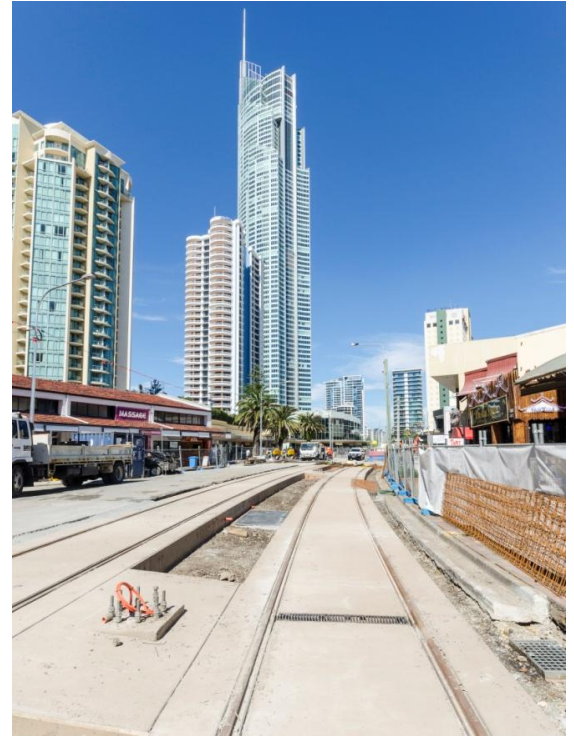


Surfers Paradise Boulevard Works Clifford Street to Thornton Street

From Monday 9 September 2013, night works will occur in sections along Surfers Paradise Boulevard between Clifford Street and Thornton Street. Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be reopened to all southbound traffic each morning. These works are scheduled to take place from 7.00pm to 6.00am to minimise the impact on traffic and surrounding residents and businesses. The works will take two weeks to complete.

Traffic changes:

- Sections of Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to through traffic between the following intersections. Each block will be closed independently and will take up to two nights to complete:
 - Hamilton Avenue to Markwell Avenue
 - Markwell Avenue to Enderly Avenue
 - Enderly Avenue to Vista Street
 - Vista Street to Thornton Street
- Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be reopened to all southbound traffic each morning.
- Local access will be maintained under traffic control for the duration of the closure.
- During construction please drive to the conditions at all times as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.



What to expect:

- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area (see map).
- Work will be carried out between 7:00pm and 6:00am, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

Night works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance of night works.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
