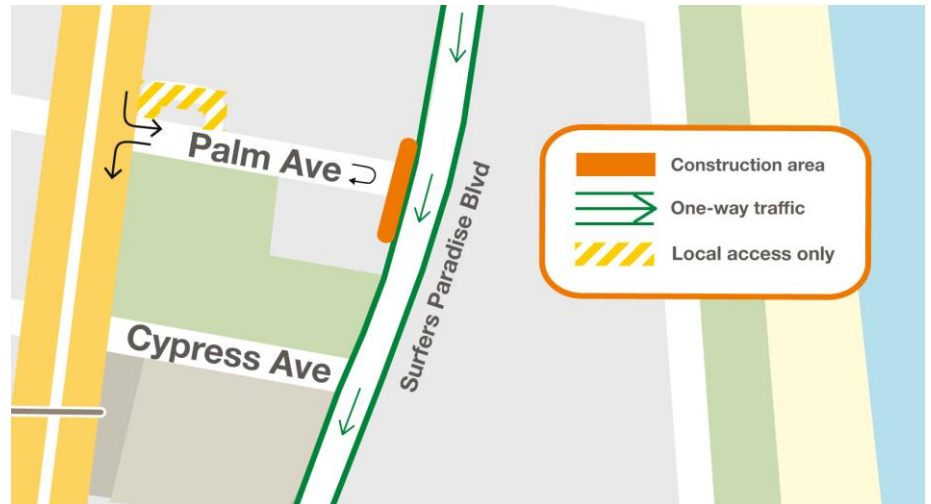




Intersection Closed for Light Rail Track Laying Palm Avenue and Surfers Paradise Boulevard

From Friday 20 September 2013, the intersection of Surfers Paradise Boulevard and Palm Avenue will be closed to traffic for two weeks to facilitate rail preparation and the construction of the track form.

The rail, which comes in 18 metre lengths each weighing one tonne, will be laid across the western side of the intersection. Due to their size, the rail lengths must be delivered at night by an oversized vehicle.



Traffic changes:

- The intersection of Palm Avenue and Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all east-west traffic (see map).
- For access to Palm Avenue local residents and businesses will be redirected to the Gold Coast Highway.
- Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.

What to expect:

- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area. Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

Night works:

- Night works will be required to install traffic management from 6:30pm Thursday 19 September 2013.
- Night works and Sunday works will be required during these works.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.

The rail, which comes in 18 metre lengths each weighing one tonne, will be laid across the western side of the intersection. Due to their size, the rail lengths must be delivered at night by an oversized vehicle.

Traffic changes:

- The intersection of Ocean Avenue and Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all east-west through traffic (see map).
- For access to Ocean Avenue local residents and businesses will be redirected to the Gold Coast Highway or the Esplanade at Ferny Avenue.
- Ocean Avenue will be two-way from the Gold Coast Highway for the duration of the closure.
- Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.

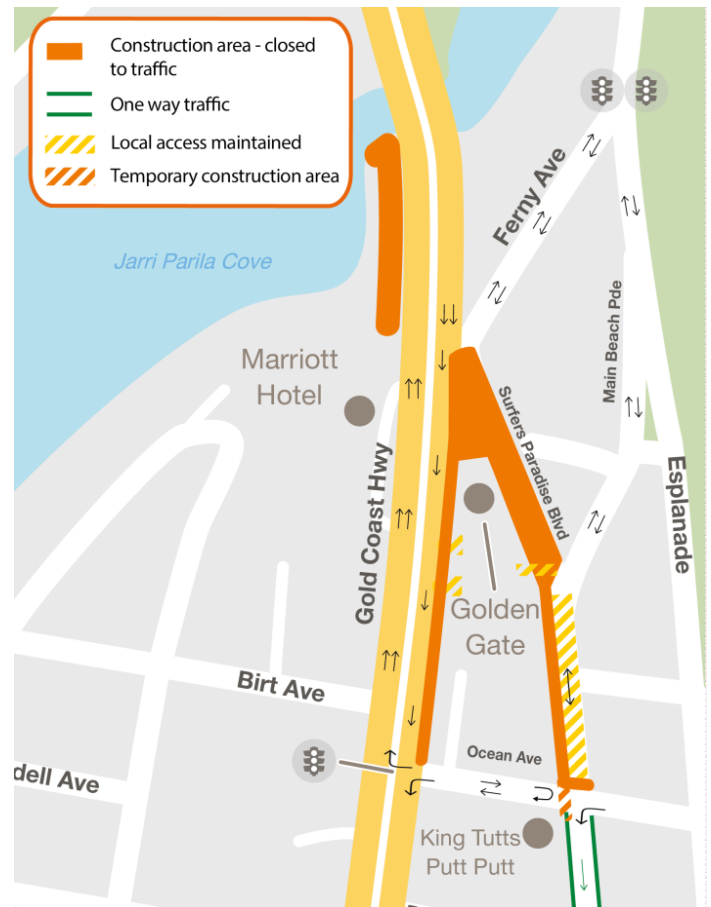
