

Footpath and Landscaping Works Alison Street to Clifford Street

From Monday 3 February 2014, footpath and landscaping works will begin along Surfers Paradise Boulevard from Alison and Trickett Street to Clifford Street.

What will the final footpath look like?

- Coloured concrete has been selected to blend in with the coastal environment of Surfers Paradise.
- Existing trees will be maintained.
 Additional vegetation will be planted in some areas.

What to expect:

- Construction of the footpath will be undertaken in two stages:
 - Raising or lowering pit lids where required and demolition of existing footpath pavement
 - 2. Pouring the final concrete footpath
- Pedestrian and business access routes will be maintained around the construction area.
- Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.

- Heavy machinery, such as jack-hammering will be used to facilitate construction.
- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Construction noise, vibration and dust. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

Night Works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance of night works.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
