

## Footpath and Landscaping Works Elkhorn Avenue to Cavill Avenue

**From Monday 3 February 2014, footpath and landscaping works will begin along Surfers Paradise Boulevard from Elkhorn Avenue to Cavill Avenue.**

### What will the final footpath look like?

- Pavers will be a polished grey finish similar to the existing tiles through Surfers Paradise.
- Existing trees will be maintained. Additional vegetation will be planted in some areas.

### What to expect:

- Construction of the footpath will be undertaken in three stages:
  1. Raising or lowering pit lids where required and demolition of existing footpath pavement
  2. Pouring a base layer of concrete
  3. Laying the final pavers
- Pedestrian and business access routes will be maintained around the construction area.
- Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Heavy machinery, such as jack-hammering will be used to facilitate construction.
- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Construction noise, vibration and dust. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

### Night Works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
