

Night Works on the Gold Coast Highway

From Wednesday 19 February 2014, night works to undertake underground service investigations along the Gold Coast Highway northbound, between Birt Avenue and Norfolk Avenue, will commence. These works are scheduled to take place at night to minimise the impact on traffic and are anticipated to take up to five nights to complete, weather permitting.

Night works:

- Single lane closures will occur on the Gold Coast Highway northbound.
- Installation of temporary safety fencing and hoarding to contain the work area at night.
- Construction will include the use of heavy machinery, including vacuum excavators, to investigate underground services.
- Traffic management will be in place to assist pedestrians and motorists. Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration may occur. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- The majority of construction work will occur from Monday to Friday, 6:30pm to 6:30am.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
