

## Surfers Paradise Boulevard Final Asphalting Beach Road to Hamilton Avenue

**From Wednesday 2 April 2014, works to install the final asphalt along Surfers Paradise Boulevard will occur from Beach Road to Hamilton Avenue.**

**To facilitate construction, a temporary road closure and intersection closures will occur each night from 6:30pm to 6:30am. These works are expected to take up to two weeks to complete.**

### Traffic changes:

- Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all southbound traffic each night from Beach Road to Hamilton Avenue (see map).
- Surfers Paradise Boulevard will re-open to southbound traffic each morning.
- During night works the intersections at Beach Road, Hanlan Street, Alison Street, Trickett Street, Laycock Street and Clifford Street will be closed.
- During night works access to side streets will be maintained via the Gold Coast Highway and the Esplanade.
- During night works local access to Alison Street and Appel Street will be maintained via Clifford Street under traffic control. Appel Street will become two-way during the temporary closure.
- Local access for residents and businesses will be maintained. Traffic management will be on site to assist motorists and pedestrians.
- Alternative routes and redirections will be signed. Please drive to the conditions at all times.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area. Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.

### What to expect:

- Heavy machinery to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30pm and 6:30am, Sunday to Friday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

### Night works:

- Night works are required to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
