




Surfers Paradise Boulevard Final Asphalt Staghorn Avenue to Elkhorn Avenue

From Wednesday 19 March 2014, works to install the final asphalt along Surfers Paradise Boulevard will occur from Staghorn Avenue to Elkhorn Avenue.

To facilitate construction, a temporary road closure and intersection closures will occur each night from 6:30pm to 6:30am. These works are expected to take up to one week to complete.



Traffic changes:

- Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all southbound traffic each night from Staghorn Avenue to Elkhorn Avenue (see map).
- Surfers Paradise Boulevard will re-open to southbound traffic each morning.
- During night works the intersections at Staghorn Avenue, Palm Avenue, Cypress Avenue and View Avenue will be closed.
- During night works access to side streets will be maintained via the Gold Coast Highway and the Esplanade.
- During night works access to Thomas Drive, Chevron Island and Cronin Island, will be detoured. Traffic will be redirected along the Gold Coast Highway to perform a u-turn at Peninsular Drive for access to Thomas Drive.
- Local access for residents and businesses will be maintained. Traffic management will be on site to assist motorists and pedestrians.
- Alternative routes and redirections will be signed. Please drive to the conditions at all times.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area. Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.

What to expect:

- Heavy machinery to facilitate construction activities.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30pm and 6:30am, Sunday to Friday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

Night works:

- Night works are required to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
