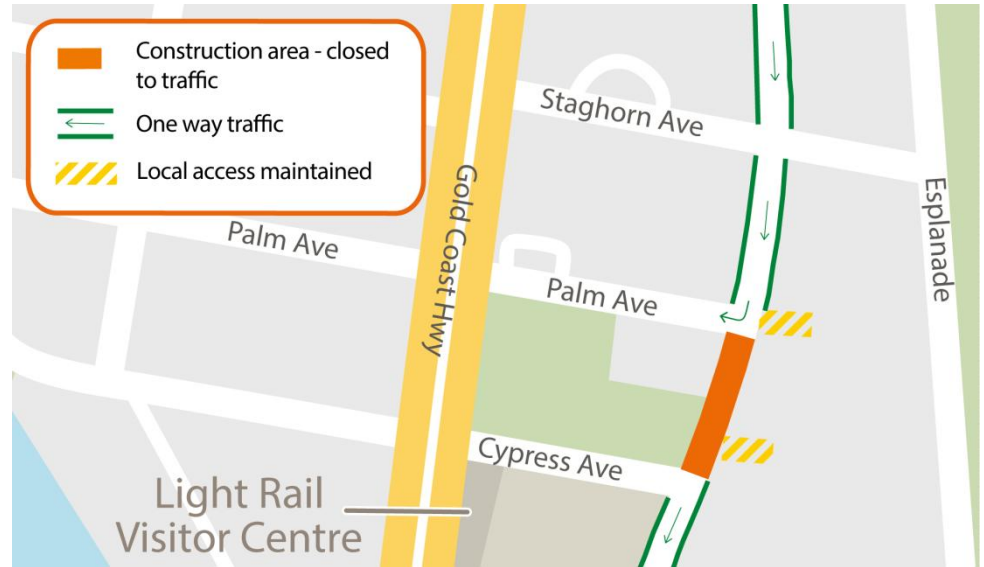


## Surfers Paradise Boulevard Closed Palm Avenue to Cypress Avenue

**From Tuesday 1 April 2014, Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to traffic from Palm Avenue to Cypress Avenue for up to one week to facilitate footpath construction.**

### Traffic changes:

- Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all southbound traffic from Palm Avenue to Cypress Avenue.
- Southbound traffic will be detoured to the Gold Coast Highway or the Esplanade at Staghorn Avenue to return to Surfers Paradise Boulevard.
- Local access for residents and businesses will be maintained via Palm Avenue.
- Pedestrian and business access routes will be maintained around the construction area.
- Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- Alternative routes and redirections will be signed. Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.



### What to expect:

- Construction of the footpath will be undertaken in two stages:
  - Raising or lowering pit lids where required and demolition of existing footpath pavement
  - Pouring a base layer of concrete
- Heavy machinery, such as jack-hammering will be used to facilitate construction.
- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Construction noise, vibration and dust. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

### Night Works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
