Get Ready, Get Set, Go!



Don't stop on the tram tracks!

When turning at a green light, remain in the traffic lane until other vehicles have passed and watch for trams in both directions.

Do not wait on the tracks for cars to pass. Penalties now apply for parking on the tracks.

It is safe to turn on a green arrow and remember to only U-Turn where a U-Turn Permitted sign is displayed.

Overhead wires are live and trams are testing from Southport to Broadbeach

Overhead wires are live and trams are testing from the Gold Coast University Hospital Station at Parklands Drive to Broadbeach South Station.

Always cross at designated crossings and look both ways before crossing the road and light rail tracks.

Parklands

Smith Street Motorway night lane closures

From Monday 2 June 2014 night works to complete feature lighting on the Smith Street bridge will occur with lane closures occurring on the Smith Street Motorway from 8pm to 5am.

Detours via Olsen Avenue and Parklands Drive will be in place.

Southport

Queen Street

From Wardoo Street to Nerang Street

Finishing works will continue and night works may occur.

Nerang Street

Between Queen and Scarborough Street

Landscaping, station construction and finishing works continue. Night works and lane closures may occur.

Scarborough Street

From Hicks Street to Queen Street

Finishing works continue in Southport. Night works and lane closures will occur.

Queen Street

From Scarborough Street to Barney Street

Day and night works will continue for landscaping, finishing works and station construction will occur.

Nerang River

Shared cycle and pedestrian bridge

Finishing works and landscaping will occur.

Nerang River barge movements

Paradise Waters

Gold Coast Highway

Finishing works continue this week, including night works. Single lane closures will be in place along the Gold Coast Highway.

Landscape works continue along Commodore Drive. Station works continue.

Main Beach

Works to install underground electrical services in the footpath and roadway will continue next week from 6:30am to 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday. Works will take place on Waterways Drive, Rankin Parade, Cronin Street and Breaker Street.

Ferny Avenue to View Avenue

Finishing works continue along Surfers Paradise Boulevard. Night and weekend works will occur.

Footpath construction works continue along Surfers Paradise Boulevard. Night and weekend work will occur. The southbound bus stop on the Gold Coast Highway at Ocean Avenue has been temporarily relocated 100 metres north.

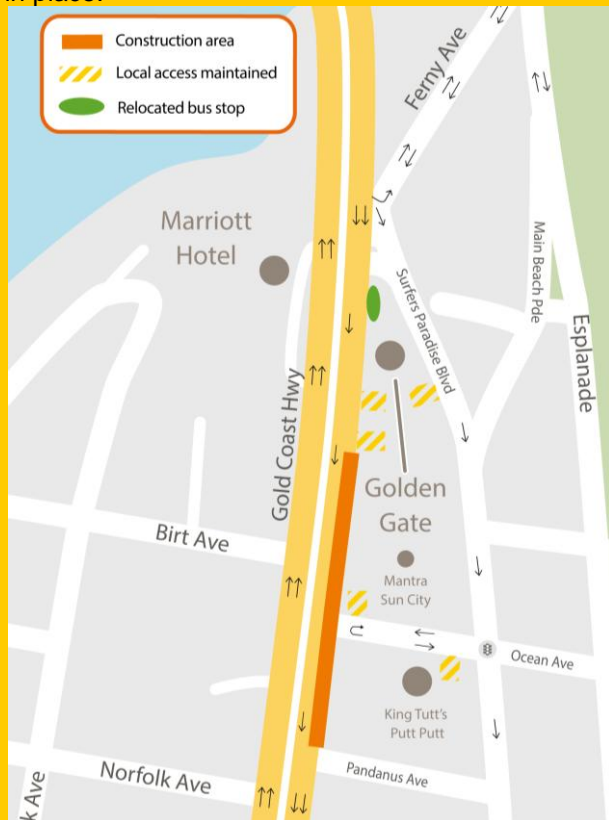

Surfers Paradise Boulevard closed from Main Beach Parade to Staghorn Avenue

Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to traffic from 6:30pm to 6:30am, Sunday to Friday, from Main Beach Parade to Staghorn Avenue to facilitate footpath construction along the eastern side.

Traffic Changes on the Gold Coast Highway and Ocean Avenue

Day, night and weekend work will continue to install a right turn lane from the Gold Coast Highway northbound into Ocean Avenue. The Gold Coast Highway is reduced to one lane southbound from Ferny Avenue intersection to Pandanus Avenue. Ocean Avenue remains closed at the Gold Coast Highway intersection (see map). Traffic detours are in place.



View Avenue to Elkhorn Avenue

Works continue to complete paving installation along the western footpath. Landscaping works continue.

Footpath finishing works are also underway, including

- Decorative stone-sets along the kerb
- Sealing and silicone of pavers.

Elkhorn Avenue to Trickett Street

Surfers Paradise Boulevard closed from Elkhorn Avenue to Cavill Avenue

Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to traffic from 6:30pm to 6:30am, Sunday to Friday, from Elkhorn Avenue to Cavill Avenue to facilitate footpath construction.

Footpath and landscaping works continue along Surfers Paradise Boulevard. Landscaping and concrete garden edging works continue. Day, night and weekend work will occur.

Footpath finishing works are also underway, including:

- Paving and grouting
- Decorative stone-sets along the kerb
- Sealing and silicone of pavers.

Station works continue.

Trickett Street to Clifford Street

Works continue to complete footpath construction along Surfers Paradise Boulevard. Landscaping preparation works continue. Day, night and weekend work will occur.

Footpath finishing works are also underway, including:

- Decorative stone-sets along the kerb
- Sandblasting and sealing of concrete.

Hamilton Avenue to Thornton Street

Finishing works continue. Night and weekend works will occur. Landscaping and station works continue.

Broadbeach

Gold Coast Highway

Remembrance Drive to Australia Avenue

Finishing works and landscaping continue. Night works and lane closure will occur.

Australia Avenue to Hooker Boulevard

Finishing works including landscaping, sandblasting and station works continue. Night works and lane closures will occur.

Timing of these works is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.
