Nerang Street Works

Southport is a medical, commercial, retail and residential hub expected to undergo significant growth in coming decades. To meet the suburb's current and future public transport needs a total of five light rail stations are being established.

As part of Southport's continued evolution, Nerang Street between Scarborough and Davenport Streets will ultimately become a pedestrian mall with a light rail station in the centre. Construction work in this part of Nerang Street will start in mid April.

To assist businesses during this time, temporary parking has been reinstated in Nerang Street between Davenport and High Streets until late 2012.

During construction:

- All pedestrian and vehicle access will be maintained.
- Safety barriers and fencing will be erected to contain the work area.
- Some on street parking will be removed.
- Extensive public utilities such as Energex will be relocated.

Current plans reflect work being carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday. Some works will occur at night to limit the impact on pedestrians and traffic. Timing of this work is subject to wet weather conditions and construction activities. Possible external influences mean plans could change, should this occur GoldLinQ will

communicate directly with those affected.

GoldLinQ is committed to minimising disruptions during construction of Queensland's first light rail system.

Fast facts

- Light rail vehicles will <u>operate</u>
 <u>frequently</u> along the route every day
 of the week with a special early
 morning service on Saturday and
 Sunday mornings. Services will run:
- > Every 7.5 minutes from 7am–7pm daily.
- > Every 15 minutes from 5am-7am and 7pm-11.50pm daily.
- > Every 30 minutes from 12midnight–5am on Friday and Saturday night.
- No services will operate from 12midnight–5am Sunday to Thursday.
- Stage One of Gold Coast light rail will reduce bus route duplication allowing existing bus services to be redistributed. This will help strengthen cross-city connectivity and improve east-west public transport options. High frequency bus services will also connect with the light rail creating a feeder service for residents and visitors to conveniently access infrastructure, businesses and major activity centres.
