

Parking changes in Southport

As part of the light rail construction work GoldLinQ has been progressively and permanently removing sections of onstreet parking in Southport.

To make it easy to access shops and businesses in Southport alternative parking is available.

Traffic and pedestrian movements will be maintained around work areas however the points of access may change. Please continue to support your local retailer during construction.

New parking

55 new spaces will become available in a car park in Queen Street, near Scarborough Street, in early September.

100 new spaces are now available in two commercial car parks in Nerang Street, on the corner of Rawlins Street, opposite Officeworks.

Scarborough Street

There are two off street car parks, at the Little Theatre site next to the Westpac bank and on the corner of White Street.



Side Streets

Two-hour parking is still available in nearby side streets including White, Garden, Lawson, and Short Streets. GoldLinQ has temporarily made 60 spaces in Nerang Street available for free parking until later in 2012.

Parking zones

Gold Coast City Council has re-allocated some parking in side streets, including Owens Lane, next to the Bendigo Bank, and in White Street, increasing convenience for shoppers.

Parking stations

There are Gold Coast City Council and privately operated parking stations a short walk from the shopping area. These include:

- Athol Paterson car park in Lawson Street (next to the library car park) which holds 183 cars.
- Mal Bourke car park in Hinze Street, near the Court House, which holds 323 cars.
- Carey Park near Marine Parade, which holds 360 cars.
- There is commercial parking available under Southport Central with access from Lawson Street.
- There is commercial parking in the TAFE building at the corner of Scarborough and Nerang Streets.
