Parklands to Southport

Parklands Drive

Energex electrical work continues around Parklands Drive. Storm water drainage work continues in the Gold Coast University Hospital Station Shell and Parklands Drive.

Smith Street and the Depot

Piling works to construct the piers for the Smith Street light rail bridge begin on Thursday 21 June. Earthworks, tunnel boring and storm water relining continues at the Depot.

Scarborough Street night and day works

The taxi shelter in Scarborough Street will be removed on Monday 18 June between 7:00pm and 5:00am. Southbound traffic lanes will be closed and traffic will be redirected along the northbound lanes under police supervision. Access to the laneways on the eastern-side of Scarborough Street will be restricted during the night. Motorists are advised to find alternate routes where possible.

On Friday 22 June the taxi rank will be temporarily relocated 100 metres north to Nerang Street mall outside the TAFE. The rank will stay in this position until construction ends in 2013, when it will move back to Scarborough Street outside Australia Fair.

The centre median and parking will be progressively removed from Scarborough Street between Nerang and Hinze Streets, outside the TAFE. Southbound traffic will move towards the kerb to allow removal of the centre median.

Paradise Waters

Vegetation clearing

Vegetation clearing continues along the western-side of the Gold Coast Highway at Paradise Waters, from the Macintosh Island North Bridge to the Gold Coast Bridge. Traffic management will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians.

Surfers Paradise

Ferny Avenue and Main Beach Parade closed to through traffic

From Monday 18 June Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all through traffic from the

intersection at Ferny Avenue (Gold Coast Highway) to Main Beach Parade for up to six weeks.

Underground service relocations and drainage upgrades will start at the intersection. Temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur. Alternative routes will be signposted and traffic management will be in place.

Night time waste water investigations

Waste water investigations will take place along Surfers Paradise Boulevard between Elkhorn Avenue and Thornton Street next week from 7:00pm to 6:00am. Single lane closures may occur and traffic management will be in place. GoldLinQ has notified directly impacted residents and businesses.

Service investigations at Elkhorn to Cavill

Investigations will continue on Surfers Paradise Boulevard between Elkhorn and Cavill Avenues. No lane closures are expected and access to businesses will be maintained. GoldLinQ has notified adjacent stakeholders.

Works to complete traffic signal upgrades

The installation and upgrade of traffic signals at the intersection of Ocean and Ferny Avenues will be completed this week. Single lane closures may occur northbound on Ferny Avenue between 9:00am and 3:00pm, and traffic management will be in place.

Waste water investigations

Night works for waste water investigations will take place on Elizabeth Avenue intersection at the Gold Coast Highway on Wednesday 20 June from 7:00pm to 6:00am. Right-turn access into Elizabeth Avenue from the northbound Gold Coast Highway will be closed to allow these works. Temporary lane closures will also occur on the southbound Gold Coast Highway, south of Hooker Boulevard. Traffic management will be in place.

Investigations will take place at Hooker Boulevard and the intersection of Queensland Avenue and the Gold Coast Highway next Wednesday 20 and Thursday 21 June. Access to Queensland Avenue southbound from the Gold Coast Highway will be closed for up to three hours at a time from 7:00am. Traffic management and detours will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians. GoldLinQ has notified local businesses.
