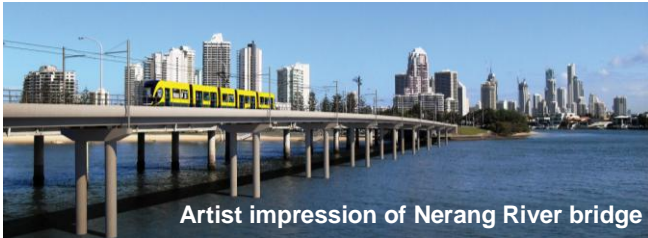
Parklands to Southport

Underground services and upcoming CBD works

Telstra relocations continue in Parklands Drive.

Underground services relocations and traffic management will start on the Smith Street Motorway west of the Parklands Drive intersection in late May.

Preparations continue for construction to start in late May in Scarborough Street between Hinze and Lawson Streets and Nerang Street between Davenport and Scarborough Streets.

Paradise Waters

Site establishment works continue

Concrete barriers have been installed along the Gold Coast Highway. These barriers close the kerbside lane reducing the highway to two lanes heading north (towards Southport). Bus stops along the highway remain open.

Minor vegetation clearing will continue within the fenced construction zone on the western-side of the Gold Coast Highway between the Gold Coast (Sundale) Bridge and Admiralty Drive. Access to this site is prohibited to the public for safety reasons.

A temporary pedestrian walkway has been provided to link Commodore Drive to the southern bus stop on the Gold Coast Highway near Admiralty Drive.

A laydown area immediately south of Macintosh Island Bridge North has now been fenced off. A construction site office and amenities will be established in this area in the coming weeks.

Surfers Paradise

Bus stop changes and works

On **Monday 14 May**, all bus stops along Surfers Paradise Boulevard, Main Beach Parade (south of Breaker Street) and Beach Street will be closed.

Passengers for routes 21, N21, 740, 745, 750 and N750 should make their way to the closest alternative stops along Gold Coast Highway, Breaker Street and Peninsular Drive.

On Monday 14 and Tuesday 15 May potholing will take place on the corner of Ocean and Ferny Avenues as part of a bus stop upgrade. Single lane closures may occur between 9am-3pm as part of this work.

Works are anticipated to commence along Surfers Paradise Boulevard in June. GoldLinQ will notify directly impacted residents and businesses before construction commences.

Broadbeach

Traffic and future bus stop change on highway

Changed traffic conditions are in place near T.E. Peters Drive. Left turn slip lanes to and from the Gold Coast Highway at T.E. Peters Drive and Hooker Boulevard have been removed. Traffic signals have been altered to incorporate a left turn signal.

Line marking is scheduled to take place at night on Monday 14 May, weather permitting. Concrete barriers, fencing and shade cloth will be installed following the traffic switch to contain work areas.

Tree clearing and mulching will continue at Moya Egerton Park.

A sign attached to the bus stop outside the Caltex service station advises passengers that the stop will be closed in coming weeks. A new stop will be provided 50 metres south of the current location.
