Traffic changes in Cougal Street, including no entry from Nerang Street

March 2011 – July 2011

Works to install large diameter wastewater and stormwater pipelines at the Nerang Street / Cougal Street intersection will require traffic changes in Cougal Street from March 2011.

Works will involve:

- Installation of large diameter wastewater and stormwater pipelines at the Nerang Street / Cougal Street intersection.
- Excavation and pipe laying using open trench construction methods.
- Temporary traffic changes in Cougal Street to enable pipeline installation works to occur.

What to expect:

- Access into Cougal Street will be available via High Street only during these works.
- Left and right turns from Nerang Street into Cougal Street will be unavailable while works are conducted.
- Traffic will remain two-way in Cougal Street. Motorists will be able to exit Cougal Street left onto Nerang Street. Alternatively, motorists can perform a u-turn in Cougal Street and exit left onto High Street (refer to map overleaf).
- Access to local businesses, driveways and carparks will be maintained. However, access may be within a works zone. The project team will work with affected businesses to minimise disruptions wherever possible.
- Pedestrian access along Nerang Street and Cougal Street will be retained. The project team asks that pedestrians take the time to cross safely on Nerang Street, and use signalized crossings wherever possible.
- The speed limit in the works zone will be reduced to 40km/h for the safety of roadworkers and motorists.
- Construction will generally be carried out from 6.30am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday. Some construction works may occur at night or outside peak periods to

minimise disruption to traffic or businesses. The project team will advise you in advance if any night works are planned near your business.

- There may be some localised noise, dust and vibration during works.

All efforts will be made to keep disruption to a minimum. We thank you for your patience and cooperation.

These works are part of Stage One of the Gold Coast Rapid Transit project, which is delivering a world-class light rail system to the Gold Coast by 2014. Stage One will connect Griffith University with Broadbeach via Southport and Surfers Paradise.

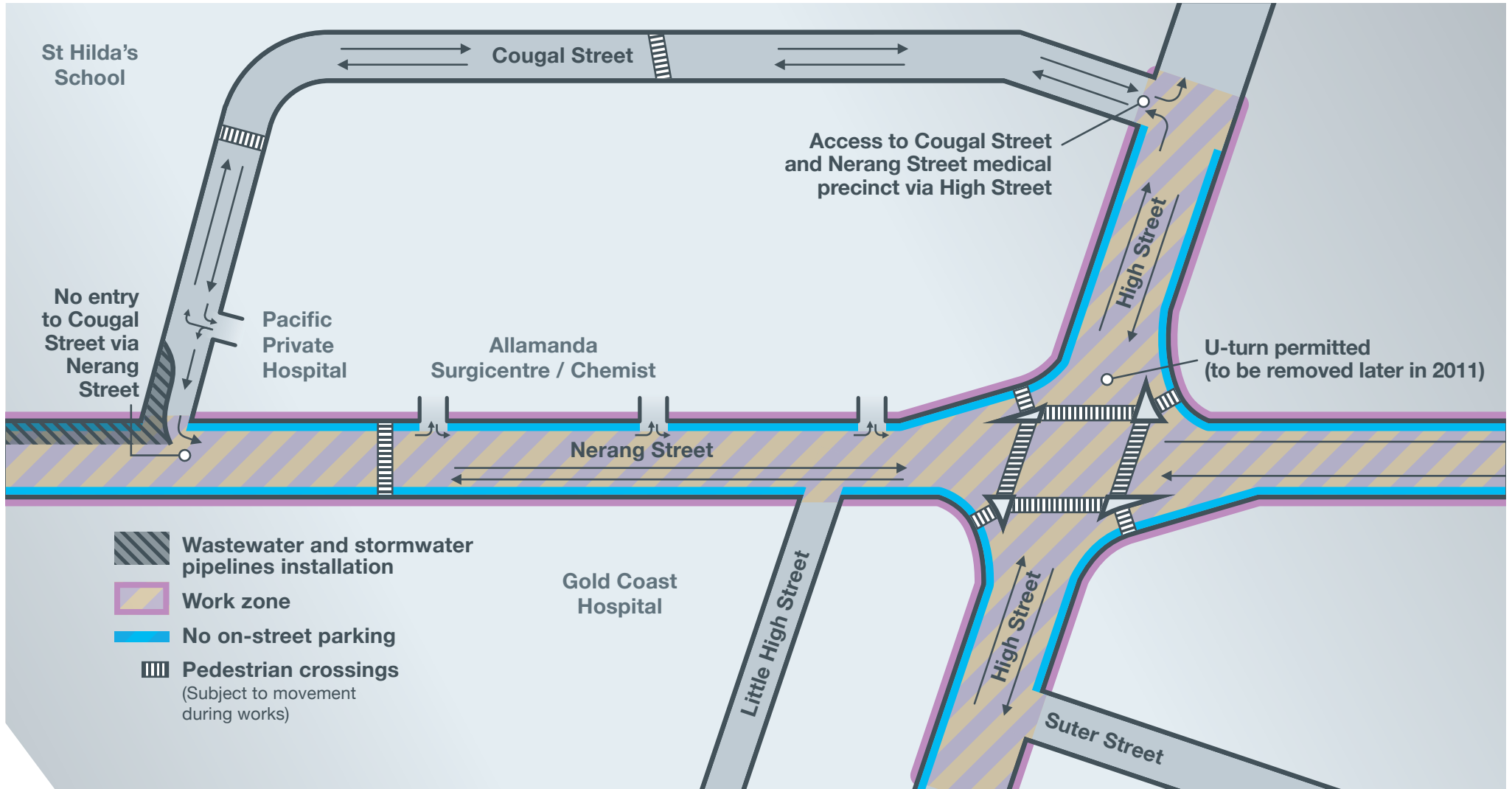
